

Nylon Netting & Cotton Backed Crocheted Scrubbie

FRONT – Nylon side

BACK – Cotton yarn side



Actual size is 5" across.

These nylon scrubbies are non-destructive to surfaces. Use these to clean everything from car tires to fine china. They're big enough for a man's hand, too! To clean: washer and drier.

Materials:

- 8 strips of burgundy color nylon netting* 1.5" wide x 72" long
- 16 yards burgundy cotton worsted weight yarn
- 16 yards black cotton worsted weight yarn
- K size crochet hook
- Large yarn needle
- Scissors

Scrubby Instructions:

Make 2. 1 out of nylon netting and 1 out of the two strands of cotton worsted weight yarn.

Rnd 1: ch-4, 7-dc in 4th ch from hook, join to top of beg ch3 (8dc)

Rnd 2: ch-3, dc in same st, 2-dc in ea dc around, join (16dc)

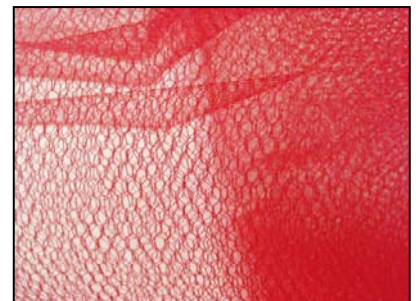
Rnd 3: ch-3, dc in same st, dc in next dc, *2-dc in next dc, dc in next dc, rep from * around, join (24 dc)

Nylon scrubbie: Finish off.

Cotton scrubbie: Attach to nylon scrubbie with sc around. Finish off leaving an 18" tail of cotton yarn. Using a large yarn needle, secure the center areas together. Weave thread into dc stitches to secure. Trim.

* Nylon Netting is stiff and scratchy. The netting comes in 72" width, therefore when folded lengthwise, your 1.5" strips will be 72" long when you cut across the width-fold.

One yard (36") of 72" wide nylon netting will produce 24 strips that measure 1.5" wide by 72" long.



Connecting the Nylon Strips:

Tie the strips together using square knots. Keep the tail pieces of the nylon on one side of the work. That one side will be the inside of the joined scrubbie.
